President's Message

SUUF ENTERS ITS 4TH DECADE! UU is an evolving faith, and we at SUUF share and model that dynamism. Our congregation embraced much change during our first 30 years (see *newsletter attachment, "A Brief History of SUUF"*) and we anticipate great changes as we continue to become the beloved community we have long envisioned.

Here are some more recent changes...

- Our Settled Ministry with Reverend Anthony Mtuaswa Johnson became official in May with the installation happening on October 21st at 3:00
- June was added to our Sunday services
- Breeze online church management system was added
- The Board of Trustees was increased from 5 to 6 members
- New Member Orientation and Brunches now occurs 2 to 3 times a year
- SUUF Membership has increased by 34 new people since May of 2022, with over 10 additional new members anticipated this month
- Financial Support of SUUF has risen accordingly
- Fellowship attendance is up 34% from Sept. '22 to Sept. '23
- Seven SUUF Teams formed in the past 2 years to enhance SUUF's effectiveness
- Three midweek home discussion groups are thriving
- Summer programs have been held in homes for the past 2 years.

And some upcoming possibilities for change...

- A task force will be formed to review and look at updating SUUF's mission, vision, and covenant. It's been over 11 years since they've been reviewed. (If you'd enjoy helping with this, let me know.)
- Plans for summer programming. We will continue Sunday services through June of '24. Do you have ideas for keeping SUUFers in touch in July and August? Let's talk!

Board Meeting Recap

All were present on Zoom 09/21/23 at 1:00: Tanya, Rev. Anthony, Gary, Helen, Elizabeth, Barb, Lee, and Rev. Anthony.

Minister's Report – Pastoral calls and meetings are ongoing. Out-of-town Multikulti Workshop 8/18 – 8/20 conducted and will do something similar here in the future. SUUF Covid policy remains the same.

President's Report –18 home meetings occurred over the summer. New Member Orientation Brunch is Oct. 7 and New Member Ceremony, Oct. 15. Membership will be 80+ in Oct. Lee updates membership data.

Treasurer's Report – Gary reviewed financial statements. He will seek guidance from UUA on how to proceed with Donate the Plate offerings. A Legacy Training is upcoming. **Caring Actions Update –** Helen noted the congregation is helpful in sharing needs and concerns for sending caring cards.

- Church of Red Rocks and SUUF are working to cooperate in presenting a "Women in Courage" program. Proceeds from a Nov. 11, 3:00 p.m. concert, will go to a charity(s) chosen by the co-sponsors. The board approved. Volunteers will be solicited to help with the event.

1. Manzanita Outreach – We will participate on Thursday, 10/12/23 between 9:30 AM and 12 Noon. Penny will follow up with those who signed up. It will be held at Manzanita headquarters at 406 S 6th Street in Cottonwood.

2. Mitzvah Day - Participate on Sunday afternoon, 10/29/23, in this day of good deeds led by JCSVV and joined by SUUF and many other churches and civic groups. Volunteers will sign in at the synagogue on Sunday, October 29, from 12:30 to 1:00, pick up food and water, sign liability forms, and get name tags with the Mitzvah Day logo. They then go to their work sites, and perform their good deeds. An alternative meeting spot is the Habitat for Humanity headquarters, at 737 South Main Street in Cottonwood.

National Coming Out Day October 11

Why is National Coming Out Day important?

National Coming Out Day is hugely important to many members of the LGBTQ+ community. Coming out is the act of being open about oneself and one's identity, whether to family, friends, or the entire world.

Coming out can be a wonderful occasion that is met with love and acceptance for many people. For others, however, it can still be a traumatic event that isolates them from family and community. NCOD encourages us to consider all the facets of coming out, and work to make it so that coming out is a joyous occasion for everyone, worldwide.

Many people no longer see the need to come out; it can simply be a case of correcting assumptions or being openly who you want to be without having to explain. However, not everyone has this luxury. For some people coming out brings with it real risks: be it estrangement from family, risks of job loss, abuse or even criminal prosecution in some countries. Until nobody needs to come out, or the day when coming out carries no risk.

Intersex Awareness Day October 26

On this day, we commemorate Intersex Awareness Day and honor the many in the global struggle for inclusion, equality, and dignity for all. The Department of State is committed to promoting and protecting the human rights of all individuals, including intersex persons, who often face discrimination, harmful medical practices, violence, and social stigma solely based on their sex characteristics.

The Department has made it a priority to include intersex voices and perspectives in U.S. diplomacy and foreign assistance. This spring, the Department established a historic precedent, offering the X gender marker on U.S. passport application forms, which paves the way for intersex, nonbinary, and gender nonconforming persons to mark unspecified or other gender. And today, we are announcing that Kimberly Zieselman, a respected intersex expert and advocate, has joined the office of the U.S. Special Envoy to Advance the Human Rights of LGBTQI+ Persons.
