**November 24:** Topic: Evolving Gratitude: It’s at 10:30 at Marj’s, 20 Sandstone Dr.

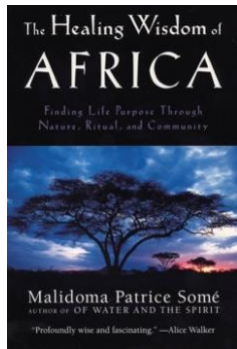
Possible questions:

I consider the twenty-plus years that I knew and studied with Malidoma to be the most enlightening and fulfilling of my life.”

Malidoma Patrice Somé, born in West Africa, is initiated in the ancestral traditions of his tribe, and is a medicine man and diviner in the Dagra culture.

He holds three master's degrees and two doctorates from Sorbonne and Brandeis University, and has taught at the University of Michigan. He and his wife, Sobonfu, conducted intensive workshops throughout the US.

# Women of Courage

“Where words fail, music speaks.” — Hans Christian Andersen

Songs and stories can uplift us when our spirits feel discouraged. We need courage to understand and address today’s many challenges. Extraordinary women throughout history have stepped up to make a difference. Their example can inspire us to feel hopeful and to do the same. Composer Mary Lou Prince and lyricist Patty Willis created the “Women of Courage” program to honor their personal heroes, women who changed the world through their courageous lives.

Each woman celebrated in this program encountered seemingly insurmountable difficulties, and each used her unique talents to transform the world into which she was born.

Some of the 11 women are well known. One song tells about Eleanor Roosevelt, who, at 74 years of age, traveled through the Tennessee countryside, while the KKK placed a \$25,000 bounty on her head. A loaded gun lay between her and the 71-year-old woman driving the car through the backwoods, on their way to the Highlander School, where she would teach a workshop on civil disobedience. The FBI offered no protection, but she had a commitment to keep.

Another is about Dolores Huerta, a co-founder of the United Farmworkers Union and mother of eleven children. She inspired her people to believe in themselves and to speak truth to power. She convinced them that they could make a difference. Her motto was, “Sí, se puede,” or “Yes, we can.”

Viola Jimulla, at the death of her husband in 1940, became the chieftess of the Yavapai people. She said, "I had to help my people in whatever they needed." Her firm but benevolent rule brought new industry and dignity to her tribe.

This program will be exceptional. Performances of other works by Patty Willis and Mary Lou Prince have been featured at international theater festivals in Tokyo, Kyoto, and Kanazawa, Japan, as well as at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival, the Parliament of World Religions, and the *Nadia Boulanger and her Students Festival* at the University of Arizona. # Board, Team, and Committee Reports

## Board Meeting Recap

The monthly board meeting was held Thursday, October 19, 2023, at 1:30 via Zoom. All were present: Tanya, Anthony, Gary, Helen, Liz and Barb. After check in and chalice lighting, Sept. minutes were approved.

**Minister's Report** – Pastoral calls ongoing. Monthly sermons and meetings highlighted, Installation to be covered later in meeting.

**President's Report** –The website has been updated and is now within the Marketing Team as our major marketing tool. Board suggestions for the website were encouraged. There are 11 SUUF policies from around 2013 to be updated. A few will be revised at each upcoming meeting. With 10 new members (3 already joining teams) we are at 83 members.

**Treasurer's Report** – Gary reviewed financial statement. He and Ben viewed a UUA webinar on legacy giving, and stated the need for a Gift Acceptance Policy, dealing with various kinds of gifts. He received the quote for the D&O Liability Insurance. Finance Team meeting will be Nov. 4<sup>th</sup>.

**Caring Actions Update** – Helen noted the gift from Anthony of the blue silk scarves for the Care Team.

**Unfinished Business** – Discussion about final logistics and security for the 10/21 Minister's Installation. The program will be recorded. D&O Liability Insurance cost is \$101 for \$1 million policy. The motion was passed to buy it. Eddie De Jarnette continues to review the JCSVV security plan. Board discussed risk assessment. Helen volunteered to be a greeter for Women of Courage concert along with Paul.

**New Business** – Board meetings will move to 3<sup>rd</sup> Friday at 1:00. Tanya proposed a new Share the Plate policy. After discussion, the policy was accepted unanimously. An updated Newsletter Policy was passed with a few revisions, as was a Name Tag Policy. So any and all can be informed, SUUF policies will soon be put on our website.

**Additional New Business** – Tanya noted 2 members to be removed from member status as they've not been active in any way for well over a year. Lee will archive them in Breeze. Members who change status, as in moving or nonattending receive letters from our secretary asking if they would like to move to "friends" status. Anthony suggested getting a headset microphone to be better heard as he moves. Gary and Anthony are to investigate different models/costs. Anthony inquired about the use of our hearing devices. We have four regular headsets which are used regularly and two that need to be connected to Bluetooth, going directly into hearing aids which haven't been used yet. A purchase of more devices was discussed with no decision made.

**Closing** – Meeting adjourned and the next meeting will be Friday, November 17, 2023 via Zoom

Thank you to all who volunteered at Manzanita Outreach October 12<sup>th</sup>. Sixteen people either packed family-sized bags of granola bars for the Saturday food distribution or put address labels on flyers. They were very grateful

for our help. We will organize another one in February 2024.

Thank you also to those who signed up to be part of our pilot “Worthy Now” project led by Paul Friedman. They will correspond monthly with incarcerated UU’s through a safe and anonymous UU program. We look forward to hearing how this goes.

**After school program snack and drink donation** will take place the first 3 Sundays in November. We support the Sedona Food Bank in providing snacks and drinks to the children who attend the after-school program at West Sedona Elementary School. This essential program for working parents is heavily utilized.

Bring your donations of individually wrapped snacks such as granola bars, small bags of chips, peanut butter, and cheese crackers, as well as juice boxes or juice pouches.

A collection box will be in the lobby at services on November 5<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>.

***Our earth and its inhabitants still need our help!***: Brazil's Amazon is in a drought and the jungle inhabitants can't use the rivers to navigate - over 125 river dolphins have recently died because of the drought and high heat. Because of climate change, grey whales are beaching themselves on N. America's Pacific shores and humpback whales are beaching on the Atlantic coast in heartbreaking numbers. Thousands of emperor penguin chicks have been lost because the sea ice melted before they could grow their water-proof feathers. The Atlantic Gulf Stream is in danger of collapse.

There is also some good news - ***please see the Environmental attachment to read about the good news as well as how groups in Arizona are doing their part to make our planet safe for future generations.***
